GCSE Options

The GCSE option blocks have been designed, and any students with subject clashes have been spoken to and letters emailed home. As some of you are aware, we are over subscribed for both RS and French, in the first instance we have asked students to reconsider their options to see if anyone would like to make changes to their current options. Thank you to the students who have already made some changes to help with this so far, the courses remain oversubscribed, so we would encourage students affected to continue to consider their options. The form for making changes closes on Friday 2nd May, after this there will be a random selection process. Parents / carers have been made aware and will be contacted to in due course to explain the random selection process if we need to proceed to this stage.

KS3 Examinations

All our KS3 students (Y7-9) will complete their exams in each subject the week before May half term, 19th- 23rd May. The exam timetables have been shared with students and are attached to the newsletter. All KS3 students will take part in a revision week prior to the examinations, this will take place next week, 28th April - 2nd May, during this week students will spend time with their subject teachers exploring different revision techniques and recapping topics in preparation for the examinations.
