Message from the Acting Headteacher:

As we reach the end of our first full week back, I would like to start by thanking every member of our school community for the way in which they have approached our return. Despite the many new systems in place and disruptions to our normal way of working, staff, students and parents have all shown great flexibility and understanding in their approach to the new academic year.

Blocking or obscuring this does put our students in danger, so we ask for your support in this matter.

Online payments

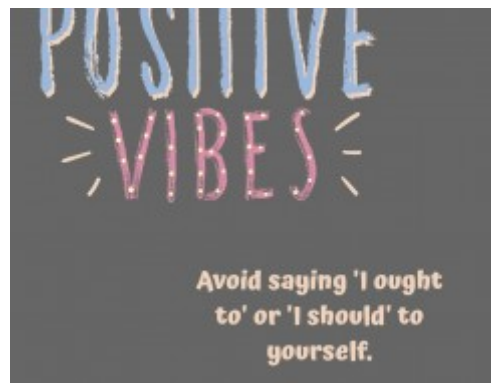
