Students will work in A2 sketchbook to research and explore their ideas creatively.

Take photographs relating to the theme and make appropriate studies in different media and processes. Mount up and present with critical analysis explaining ideas and how they relate to artists. Development work using appropriate media, processes and techniques producing compositional ideas relating to intentions. Create studies, compositional pieces, techniques and process development and practise ideas for the final piece. Mount up all development work before examination with critical analysis explaining ideas.
