Full-time, temporary. Required for September 2024

The Governors of this exceptional Grammar School wish to appoint a well-qualified and enthusiastic Teacher of French & German for September 2024. The post is full-time and on a temporary, maternity cover basis. The ability to teach Key Stage 3 French and German is essential and the ability to teach Key Stage 4 is desirable. A good degree in French, German or a closely related subject is sought, and a strong knowledge of teaching Modern Foreign Languages will be important to the role. A good understanding of examination requirements is desirable and a strong track record of motivating learners and raising achievement is essential. This post would suit a newly or recently qualified teacher, for whom extensive support and encouragement will be given, or a more experienced practitioner.

The Languages faculty at WKGS is dedicated to creating the very best linguists and students with a passion for communication in another language. In our faculty, everyone is supported to develop their own interests and passions, but students are taught the value of all language learning and that gaining the skills to learn a language can open the doors to many other languages further into their academic journey.

Students are encouraged and supported by dedicated teachers to develop their knowledge, skills and understanding to a high standard. Our curriculum model allows Year 7 students to learn two modern languages from French, German and Spanish, as well as an introduction to Latin. In Years 8 and 9 students continue to study two of the previously studied languages. At KS4 and 5, students can study one or both of the languages they have already studied. They follow specifications from Pearson Edexcel for all public exams, except for A level Spanish, where the AQA specification is followed.

The KS3 curriculum across French, German and Spanish follows topics from the Dynamo, Stimmt and Viva textbooks from Pearson, but the faculty works hard to adapt resources and tailor the curriculum to WKGS learners and has recently incorporated ideas and activities from the EPI method of teaching languages.

In addition to the curriculum offer outlined here, a small cohort of students sit GCSE Italian as an additional qualification every two years, and the faculty actively supports students who wish to take a qualification in their home or community language. This year has seen students take GCSEs in Mandarin, Cantonese and Turkish, as well as A level Cantonese.

The faculty is situated at the heart of the school, with 7 dedicated teaching rooms, a workroom, a set of Google Chrome workbooks, and easy access to bookable computer suites. Students are all able to access online textbooks and associated activities.

Teachers across the faculty are all enthusiastic and passionate linguists qualified in a range of languages, allowing for a unified approach to teaching and learning. In addition to 7 modern languages teachers, each year the faculty welcomes 3 Modern Language Assistants in French, German and Spanish via the British Council. They work largely with KS4 and 5 students preparing for public exams but are an important part of the faculty, offering native speaker expertise to all learners.

The faculty aims to provide as many opportunities as possible to experience and practise outside the classroom, offering visits and exchanges abroad, masterclass and taster sessions in languages from universities, opportunities to collaborate with other local schools, lunchtime clubs and drop-in sessions and a modern language DVD and literature satellite library.

West Kirby Grammar School is a very successful selective girls' school with a coeducational Sixth Form. There are over 1200 students on roll and results are exceptional. In 2023, an Attainment 8 score of 67.7 was achieved and 52% of results were at grades 9-7 and 13% of all results were at grade 9. At A-level, 66% of grades were A*-B with the average grade achieved being a B.
