Travelling in the Spanish-speaking world will require you to know lots of vocabulary and manage in different situations.

This builds on:

Y8 topics of Holidays

This leads to:

GCSE Module 6: talking about towns and cities.

We will learn:

- To discuss travel plans
- To talk about festivals in the Spanish-speaking world
- To say what you did on holiday
- To describe where you stayed
- To use different tenses to talk about holidays

We will develop/practise skills including:

- Using 'me gusta' etc / 'se puede(n)' with an infinitive
- Using the comparative and superlative
- Using 'if' clauses
- Using the imperfect
- Using 'acabar de' + infinitive
- Using 'suelo' + infinitive
- Using a range of opinions in different tenses

Year 10 Spanish– *Mi gente, mi mundo*

Learning about this topic is important because:

These topics are relevant to young people's everyday lives and help you communicate about familiar experiences. They develop key language skills by enabling you to express opinions, discuss relationships, interests and future aspirations, and engage with modern forms of communication. Studying these themes also promotes cultural understanding and prepares you to use Spanish confidently in real-life situations.

This builds on:

This area of study builds upon the language and vocabulary you learned at Key Stage 3, where you talked about yourself, your family, your hobbies, daily routines and your use of technology. It develops your ability to communicate in greater detail, express and justify your opinions, and use a wider range of grammatical structures. You will also deepen your understanding of cultural similarities and differences between your own experiences and those of people in Spanish-speaking countries.

This leads to:

This area of study prepares you for further language learning at A Level and beyond by developing your confidence and fluency in communicating about familiar and relevant topics. It strengthens your ability to understand and respond to a range of spoken and written texts, while building transferable skills such as communication, critical thinking and cultural awareness. These skills are valuable for future study, employment and participation in an increasingly global society.

We will learn:

- To talk about different family models
- To describe people
- To talk about who you admire
- To talk about friendships and relationships
- To talk about identity and what matters to you
- To talk about problems and give advice

We will develop/practise skills including:

- *Using possessive adjectives*
- *Using the present continuous to describe a picture*
- *Using “ser” for physical descriptions and “estar” for location*
- *Saying how long you have been doing something*
- *Using the personal “a”*
- *Using reflexive verbs*
- *Using the pronouns “me” and “te” before a verb*
- *Using “para + infinitive”*
- *Using “estar” to express moods*
- *Using “podrías/deberías + infinitive”*

This topic also encourages you to reflect on your own lifestyle choices while building essential communication skills for your GCSE examinations and beyond.

This builds on:

The vocabulary and grammar you have already learned about yourself, your daily routine, hobbies, food, and free-time activities. It helps you extend your ability to express opinions, justify your ideas, and give advice while discussing healthy habits, exercise, mental health, and nutrition. This topic deepens your understanding of real-life issues and prepares you to communicate confidently in your GCSE examinations and beyond.

This leads to:

Learning about lifestyle and wellbeing in GCSE Spanish leads to more advanced discussions about health, society, and personal responsibility in further language study. It equips you with the communication skills needed to express complex opinions, give recommendations, and engage with authentic Spanish-language media and real-world situations. The topic also supports your wider understanding of wellbeing, helping you become a more informed and culturally aware global citizen.

We will learn:

- Learning about typical foods in Spanish-speaking countries.
- Describing healthy daily routines.
- Talking about mealtimes and food trends.
- Talking about mealtimes and food trends.
- Comparing old and new habits.
- Talking about illnesses and injuries.
- Future plans for health and wellbeing.

We will develop/practise skills including:

- *Using adjectives of nationality.*
- *Using indefinite adjectives.*
- *Using tener + noun*
- *Using direct object pronouns*
- *Practicing listening skills*
- *Using the imperfect tense to say what you used to do*
- *Using ya no + verb*
- *Using reflexive verbs in the preterite tense*
- *Giving advice using debes, tienes que and necesitas*
- *Using the simple future tense*
- *Using “if clauses”*
