Learning about this topic is important because:

It will enable you to develop your knowledge of how to describe where you live, talk about changes in your area and give opinions about towns and cities.

This builds on:

Y8SP1 *Mi ciudad*: your knowledge of places in town, describing your local area and giving opinions; and GCSE Module 2 *Viajes*: talking about places, travel and using a range of time frames.

This leads to:

GCSE Module 7 *Un mundo mejor para todos*, where you will develop your ability to discuss communities, environmental issues and ways of improving the world around you.

We will learn:

- How to describe cities
- How to describe how a city or town has changed
- How to talk about shopping preferences
- How to give preferences about where you live
- How to talk about your local area

We will develop/practise skills including:

- Using demonstrative adjectives
- Using the perfect tense
- Using prepositions of place for directions
- Comparing then and now using the imperfect tense
- Revising direct object pronouns
- Using the present subjunctive with *cuando*
- Revising comparisons
- Using a variety of verb tenses
- Talking about future plans in different ways

This leads to:

GCSE speaking and writing preparation, where you will apply increasingly complex language and grammar from across the course more independently.

We will learn:

- About natural wonders of Spanish-speaking countries
- How to talk about how you help your community
- How to talk about climate change
- How to talk about actions to help the environment
- How to discuss solutions

We will develop/practise skills including:

- Using pronouns after prepositions
- Using the imperative
- Using *falta, hace falta, vale la pena* and *basta*
- Using and avoiding the passive
- Using the imperfect continuous
- Using negatives
- Using the present subjunctive to give opinions
- Translating more complex texts
- Using *(no) se debería + infinitive*
- Understanding multiple details

This leads to:

Final GCSE speaking and writing preparation, where you will apply language for education, employment and future plans using a broad range of vocabulary and grammatical structures. These skills also provide a foundation for further study at A level.

We will learn:

- About Latino trailblazers
- How to talk about your plans for the future
- How to talk about getting a job
- How to talk about future career intentions
- How to discuss the importance of learning languages
- How to talk about changes in the world of work
- How to discuss the impact of AI

We will develop/practise skills including:

- Using Spanish stress patterns correctly
- Using *seguir/continuar + present participle*
- Transcribing unfamiliar words
- Using possessive pronouns
- Using prepositions followed by the infinitive
- Using masculine and feminine nouns for jobs
- Understanding more complex texts
- Listening for percentages
- Using *para que + subjunctive*
- Working out the infinitive of a conjugated verb
