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YEAR 9 – UNITS 3 AND 4 - Vorbilder



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Learning about this topic is important because: it will enable you develop your knowledge of how to describe people, their actions and their achievements.

This builds on: work covered on descriptions of friends and members of the family

This leads to:

Being able to talk about other people including friends and members of your family and people who are important in your life.

Being able to understand others talking in more depth about the positive qualities of others

We will learn:

- How to talk about different role models
- How to talk about what people have done in their life
- How to use the perfect tense in descriptions of past events
- How to talk about how another person inspires you
- How to write longer descriptions with greater accuracy: applying spelling rules of phonics, verb formation and word order
- How to translate from German into English conveying meaning accurately

We will develop/practise skills including:

- Listening to more complex passages identifying both actions and tenses
- Writing: matching sound to spelling
- Applying grammatical rules more accurately to describe the past, present and future
- Translation of longer passages in reading comprehension

Year 9 German – Units 5 and 6 - Musik

Learning about this topic is important because: it will enable you develop your knowledge of how to talk about what type of music you like and to explain your opinions. You will learn how to use the correct words for “it” (there is more than one!) and you will continue to practise using the perfect tense.

This builds on: work covered in Units 1-4, which introduced and practised using a range of verbs in the perfect tense and using verbs that take both *haben* and *sein*.

This leads to:

Being able to talk about your and other people’s opinions about music and music festivals

Becoming more confident at using the perfect tense to talk about a wider range of topics.

We will learn:

- How to talk different types of music
- How to talk about playing or singing in a band
- How to compare different bands and the music they play
- How to describe a music festival that you have been to

We will develop/practise skills including:

- Listening to more complex and detailed listening activities and identifying not just what the text is about, but also which tenses are being used
- Matching spelling to sound by practising reading aloud
- Using the perfect tense more accurately without having to check notes and sentence builders
- Translating longer texts
- Listening for spelling by using dictation tasks

Some of the vocabulary that we will use includes:

- Auxiliary verb, past participle
- Subordinating conjunctions

You could learn more about this topic by:

Listening to some of the songs that you will come across and looking at the lyrics to some of their songs. You will come across: Tokio Hotel, Nina, Falco, Wincent Weiss and Die Fantastischen Vier. Check them out on YouTube or Spotify!
